

ASCCP Abstract Review Process Policy

Summary of the ASCCP Abstract Review Process

- Each abstract is sent to 3 reviewers
- Reviewers rate each abstract independently on a scale of 1–5 (double-blind procedure) and optionally submit comments
- The overall mean score is calculated with is an average of each reviewer's individual scores, and then each of the 3 reviewers composite scores averaged together
- Abstracts are ranked by overall mean score and COI compliance
- Approximately 20 orals and 50 posters are chosen (this changes annually depending on program availability and quality of abstracts)
- Program Directors determine when each oral presentation is given based on their category
- and subject matter

Assignment of Abstracts to Reviewers

Abstracts are individually assigned to 3 reviewers on the basis of category submitted by the author, and the abstract reviewers' self-identified category expertise.

Rating by External Reviewers

- Reviewers rate each abstract independently on a scale of 1–5 (double-blind procedure) over 3 criteria: Originality, Relevance, and Overall Impression. These ratings then calculate an overall abstract score.
- Reviewers vote Yes/No if the Abstract followed abstract and ethics guidelines.
 - o Note: Guidelines are updated annually and provided to Reviewers for reference.
- Reviewers vote Yes/No if the Abstract is recommended for an Oral presentation.
- Reviewers vote Yes/No if an Abstract should receive an award, and specify which award. Program Directors make the final decision.
 - o Note: If an award winner is industry, they either need to decline the award or have ASCCP donate the monies to a charity of their choice.



COI Review

- Abstracts that are distinctly about a specific product and/or has an author who is an employee (including those with stock) of a commercial interest are not accepted for CME (oral presentation). These abstracts are automatically considered for posters only.
- Disclosure box is on the poster template and disclosure instructions added to the guidelines.
