Journal of Lower Genital Tract Disease Appoints Editor-in-Chief

Frederick, Maryland, December 16, 2016 – ASCCP, The Society for Lower Genital Tract Disorders, has appointed David Foster, MD, MPH as Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Lower Genital Tract Disease.

Foster is a Professor Emeritus in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Rochester Medical Center, School of Medicine and Dentistry. Foster obtained his medical degree from the Thomas Jefferson University and later completed his residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Johns Hopkins Hospital and a fellowship at Hopkins in Gynecologic Pathology under Dr. J Donald Woodruff. Foster then worked in a private practice for 7 years before returning to Johns Hopkins to serve as a full-time faculty member in the Department of Gynecology and Obstetrics and later earned his Masters in Public Health in Epidemiology. Since 1996, Foster has been a full-time faculty member of the Division of Gynecologic Specialties at the University of Rochester.

Foster's research has focused on vulvar disease, in general, and vulvodynia specifically. His recent research has spanned the performance of two large-scale randomized clinical trials in vulvodynia and basic science investigation of lower genital tract neuro-inflammation.
